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





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# Celebrate 30 Years with Susan Aglukark!



This Child Tour
A Personal Call to Action

Susan is embarking on her 30th Anniversary of This Child Tour with special guest Angela Amarualik, who is also an Inuk artistwhowas born and raised in Igloolik, Nunavut and has travelled across Canada performing as a throat singer, folk singer, and pop music artist.

Susan's writing of This Child brought her to a personal call to action, get on the platform and speak up, learn, heal, share, this has been her work for these 30 years.

Susan is Canada's first Inuk artist to win a Juno (4 in total), a Governor General's Performing Arts Award for lifetime artistic achievement, and she is an officer of the Order of Canada. Susan holds several Honourary Doctorate degrees and has held command performances.

Susan's journey as a singer-songwriter began in the early 1990s when she began her writing and recording career. In Susan's early reflections was the discovery of the platform as learning, sharing and healing, this inspired her major label debutalbum This Child, released in January 1995.

Susan has since written and recorded 10 albums, founded the Arctic Rose Foundation, authored two children's books and has a personal memoir in the works.

#### About Angela Amarualik

Angela Amarualik was born and raised in Igloolik, Like many small communities in Canada's Arctic, Igloolik had many social problems. Angela worked hard to retain good attitude, improve circumstances, and be a role model for the younger kids in her town. Already community role model - as well as Miss Igloolik - Angela now uses her music to inspire Nunavummiut youth and share Inuit culture with people around the world. Starting off

with the ukulele, Angela began writing songs in her native language, Inuktitut. Her musical style is a mix between ancient Inuit melodies and throat-singing, and the pop music of her childhood heroes Beatrice Deer and Hilary Duff. Her music has taken her across Canada, and in 2018, Angela released her self-titled debut album. The album was nominated for 3 Indigenous Music Awards, including Best New Artist. And took home the Award for the Best Inuit, Indigenous Language, or Francophone Album.

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#### Need to warm up? A little of this decadent hot chocolate goes a long way.

There's no doubt that cold weather is a good excuse for making this delectable treat. And if you have ever visited Angelina in Paris and tasted their hot chocolate, you know what I mean when I say a little goes a long way. It is the thickest, sweetest and richest hot chocolate I've ever enjoyed. But while it's fun to taste it in Paris, my preferences lean more bittersweet and lighter in texture.

When shopping for ingredients, look for good-quality chocolate and cocoa. I prefer Valrhona or Guittard chocolate. Finding sweetened cocoa can be a bit of a challenge. I use Ghiradelli.

What makes this drink so special is the chocolate whipped cream that crowns the creamy chocolate beverage. For a richer hot chocolate, you can substitute half and half or cream for the whole milk. Use a microplaner or grater to grate the bittersweet chocolate for the garnish.

This hot chocolate is meant to be enjoyed as dessert in little espresso cups. You can find inexpensive shot glasses and espresso cups at World Market. Of course, you can multiply this recipe for larger cups, but recently I served this drink as a dessert in small espresso cups at a dinner party and my guests loved it. They appreciated the small portion with big flavor after a rich meal.

#### Hot Chocolate with Chocolate Whipped Cream (Serves 4)

**Note:** An important cooking tip is to whisk the hot chocolate to create a froth.

#### For the Chocolate Whipped Cream:

1/2 cup chilled heavy whipping cream 1 teaspoon sweetened cocoa powder Grated bittersweet chocolate, for garnish

#### For the hot chocolate:

1 tablespoon sweetened cocoa powder 3/4 ounce bittersweet chocolate (70% to 75% cacao), chopped Pinch kosher salt

1 cup whole milk or half and half



- 1. Beat together the cream and cocoa powder in a chilled bowl with an electric mixer or whisk until soft peaks form. Reserve.
- 2. In a small heavy saucepan combine the cocoa powder, chopped chocolate, salt and milk. Place mixture over medium heat, whisking gently. Once the chocolate melts and cocoa dissolves, raise the heat to medium high; whisk more vigorously to form froth on surface. When mixture bubbles around edges and seems ready to boil, remove from heat. Do not let it boil.
- 3. Ladle into four espresso cups. With a spoon place a dollop of the chocolate whipped cream and grated bittersweet chocolate on top of each cup. Serve immediately.

#### Put Canada First & Build!

Canada needs to be a country that can build again; infrastructure, national energy projects, ports, irrigation, damns, military installations, to name a few examples. One of the most disastrous legacies of the current Liberal Government, is that Canada has been unable to build basically anything unless it is approved by a massive bureaucracy in Ottawa, supported by taxpayers, is past deadlines, and over budget. This has led to a massive decrease in our national productivity and has hurt our economy, national unity, and our resilience.

Current trade uncertainty has emphasized how disastrous these policies have been. And while the Liberals say they have changed their minds, it is nothing more than a narrative to mask their sudden realization of how their decisions over the last decade have weakened Canada.

Conservatives, led by Pierre Poilievre, will make sure energy development is allowed to occur in Canada, leading to more prosperity and sovereignty for all Canadians. We will immediately scrap Bill C-69 and greenlight LNG plans, pipelines, factories, and port expansions to overseas markets. Additionally, we need to not "rebrand and hide" the carbon tax, we need to axe it all together! The key is that these aren't new positions for Canada's Conservatives, but rather what we have championed all along.

Additionally, if our federation is going to allow our people to prosper, we must remove barriers to prosperity which exist within our own borders. Conservatives have historically reduced, and if elected, will continue to reduce interprovincial trade barriers. Canada can become Canada's largest trading partner which will reduce reliance on foreign markets for our economic freedom. These barriers have created a de facto tariff on our own goods, costing our people billions of dollars a year.

Canada needs strong leadership to fix a decade of destructive policies which has left Canada poorer and weaker. I am proud to be a part of Pierre Poilievre's Canada First Team, which will ensure that Canada can once again build what is needed to prosper so Canadians can ultimately prosper from the blessings our country has to offer.
